Dunnville Christian School

The boards of Dunnville Christian School and Canadian Hallmarks Institute (CHI) are pleased to publish this *Accreditation Profile* as a public service promoting independent faith-based education in the greater Hamilton area. The format of this profile follows CHI standards: The contents of this profile were developed using local information obtained as part of the successful accreditation review.

1. Mission:

The official mission of the school is:

To provide quality Christian Education within a loving and secure environment. Students are equipped to grow in knowledge and wisdom and challenged to develop the gifts in service to God and others.

2. Governance:

Dunnville Christian School is owned by the Dunnville Christian School Society and operated on its behalf by an elected board of 9 directors. The Dunnville Christian School Society is a registered charity (#107270415RR0001) and membership in the society is open to all adults who meet the criteria.

3. Community Demographics of School

- a) The families supporting Dunnville Christian School come from a wide range of socio-economic backgrounds. A total of 36 different occupations are represented as well as a large economic range, from needy to wealthy families.
- b) The general statistics for Haldimand County taken from Stats Canada Reports (2005), which provide the following:
 - Average (full-time income all families) \$61,776
 - Average (income single/parent families) \$26,835

4. Admission Policies for Students

- a) The Dunnville Christian School Board has adopted a policy of non-discrimination in support of the Ontario Human Rights Code. In promoting its distinctive Christian character, the policy requires that students should:
 - be able to benefit from the programs offered and that parents should
 - declare their (his/her) support of the school's religious identity as evident in official documents.
- b) The student body is 100% composed of Canadian citizens.

5. Faculty

- a) Dunnville Christian School has 3 full-time and 5 part-time teaching staff, 50% of whom have the Ontario Teacher's Certificate, 90% hold the Christian Teacher's Certificate and 25% hold both the Ontario Teacher's Certificate and the Christian Teacher's Certificate.
- b) The average teaching experience of the staff is 17 years (full time equivalent). The board requires an annual program of professional development for all teachers.
- c) The pupil-teacher ratio (PTR) is 19:1 for 2009/10.

6. Student Achievement

Dunnville Christian School has a student body of 85 and a complete JK-8 program. The faculty follows a defined evaluation program to monitor the academic and social progress of each student.

- a) Basic Skills - The school participates in the Ontario Alliance of Christian Schools (OACS) student assessment program on an annual basis. In 2008, Grades 3 - 8 participated in the Canadian Tests of Basic Skills (CTBS) with outstanding results.

- b) Literacy Test from Province - The school does not participate in the elementary provincial tests sponsored by the Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO) because of the fees levied on non-funded private schools by the EQAO as a cost of participation.

- c) Dunnville Christian School graduates attend Smithville District Christian High School where students score an average of 91% on the Provincial Literacy Test, Lakeshore Catholic High School where students score an average of 83% on the Provincial Literacy Test and Dunnville Secondary School where students score an average of 75% on the Provincial Literacy Test.
- d) Other significant awards given are the Principal's Plaque, French Award, Citizenship Award, Speech Award, Spelling Award, Geography Challenge, and Valedictorian Award.

7. Programs of Study

- a) Dunnville Christian School offers a complete range of academic programs for all eight grades. The curriculum follows the outline developed by the OACS. This design follows the official Ministry of Education curriculum in content requirements.
- b) The board and faculty are committed to the integration of Christian perspectives throughout the entire program of studies.
- c) Dunnville Christian School has a special education resource program and a special needs program. It provides technological studies at many grade levels to ensure that students acquire computer literacy before graduation.

8. Finances

- a) Dunnville Christian School obtains its income from several sources, notably:
 - 63% from tuition;
 - 22% from donations;
 - 0% from government grants;
 - 10% from fundraising events;
 - 5% other
- b) 2009/2010 Year the tuition rate was \$9,975, family rate (includes transportation).
- c) For families experiencing temporary financial hardship, the board provides assistance in the form of tuition reduction.
- d) The official budget is approved each spring at a general membership meeting. The budget expenditures are as follows:

● education, salaries and benefits	65%
● transportation	18%
● facilities, operating	8%
● facilities capital & mortgage interest	2.5%
● program	0%
● administration	1%
● other	5.5%

9. Membership

Dunnville Christian School is part of a large family of schools known as the Ontario Alliance of Christian Schools (OACS). This provincial organization provides general policy guidelines on all matters relevant to operating a school in Ontario. Dunnville Christian School is also a member of Christian Schools Canada (CSC) and Christian Schools International (CSI). The school is registered as a private school with the Ontario Ministry of Education and submits annual reports as required by law.
